October 10, 2021 The Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

October 11 is the Memorial of **Pope Saint John XXIII**. Pope John was born Angelo Roncalli in 1881. He studied for the priesthood in the Diocese of Bergamo and was ordained priest in 1904. Serving in the medical corps of the Italian Army during the First World War, he experienced war's horrors as a stretcher-bearer and chaplain. Padre Roncalli was ordained a bishop in 1925 and appointed Apostolic Visitor to Bulgaria, then Apostolic Delegate to Turkey and Greece and finally Apostolic Nuncio to France. He became Patriarch of Venice and five years later was elected Pope on October 28, 1958, at age 76. The following year, Pope John announced the Second Vatican Council, which opened on October 11, 1962. This council would discern how to bring the Gospel to the rapidly changing modern world. Pope John was a dedicated pastor and had a deep desire for reconciliation with other Christians as well as for peace in the world. Pope John continued the development of the Church's social teaching with his encyclical, *Mother and Teacher* in 1961. He mediated quietly in the Cuban Missile Crisis and published the encyclical, *Peace on Earth*, "on establishing universal peace in truth, justice, charity and liberty" in 1963. Pope John died on June 3, 1963. He was beatified by Pope St John Paul II in 2000 and canonized by Pope Francis in 2014.
