The First Reading (Isaiah 53:10-11) permits us to hear part of Isaiah's great prophecy of the Servant of God who suffers for others. In what was an almost incomprehensible statement at the time it was made, Christians later recognized perhaps the most important prophecy of Christ's vicarious suffering. Of course there were hints of this idea earlier: Abraham's intercession for Sodom, and, more distinctly, Moses' forty days of fasting before the face of God as intercession for the sinful people. The Servant of God surpasses Moses, however, because the entire meaning of his existence seems to be bound up in his suffering on behalf of the people, a suffering no one can grasp. The Ethiopian eunuch reads this passage and cannot understand it; the deacon Philip explains it with reference to Christ (Acts 8). The Jews later found their own experience mirrored in what happened to this figure scorned and shunned by all. Such a reading is not mistaken, if their suffering has indeed been drawn into Jesus' all-encompassing atoning Passion. – from Light of the Word, by Hans Urs von Balthasar

October 19 is the Memorial of the Martyrs of North America, **Saints Isaac Jogues and Jean de Brébeuf**, Priests and Companions. Between the years 1642 and 1649 eight members of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) were killed in North America, after fearful torture by members of the Huron and Iroquois tribes. These men had worked hard to bring the natives of the region to the true faith. St Isaac Jogues died on October 18, 1647, and St Jean de Brébeuf on March 16, 1648. - *from the Liturgy of the Hours*
