January 4 is the Memorial of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton. Elizabeth was born on August 28, 1774, of a wealthy and distinguished Episcopalian family. She was baptized Episcopalian and was a faithful adherent of the Episcopal Church until her conversion to Catholicism. In 1794, Elizabeth married William Seton and they reared five children amid suffering and sickness. Elizabeth and her sick husband traveled to Leghorn, Italy, and there William died. While in Italy Elizabeth became acquainted with Catholicism and in 1805, she made her profession of faith in the Catholic Church. She established her first Catholic school in Baltimore in 1808; in 1809 she established a religious community in Emmitsburg, Maryland. After seeing the expansion of her small community of teaching sisters to New York, and as far as St Louis, she died on January 4, 1821 and was declared a saint by Pope St Paul VI on September 14, 1975. - from the Liturgy of the Hours

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy, we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the 2nd day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the 17th day of April, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 29th day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 5th day of June, the feast of Pentecost.

On the 19th day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the 27th day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
